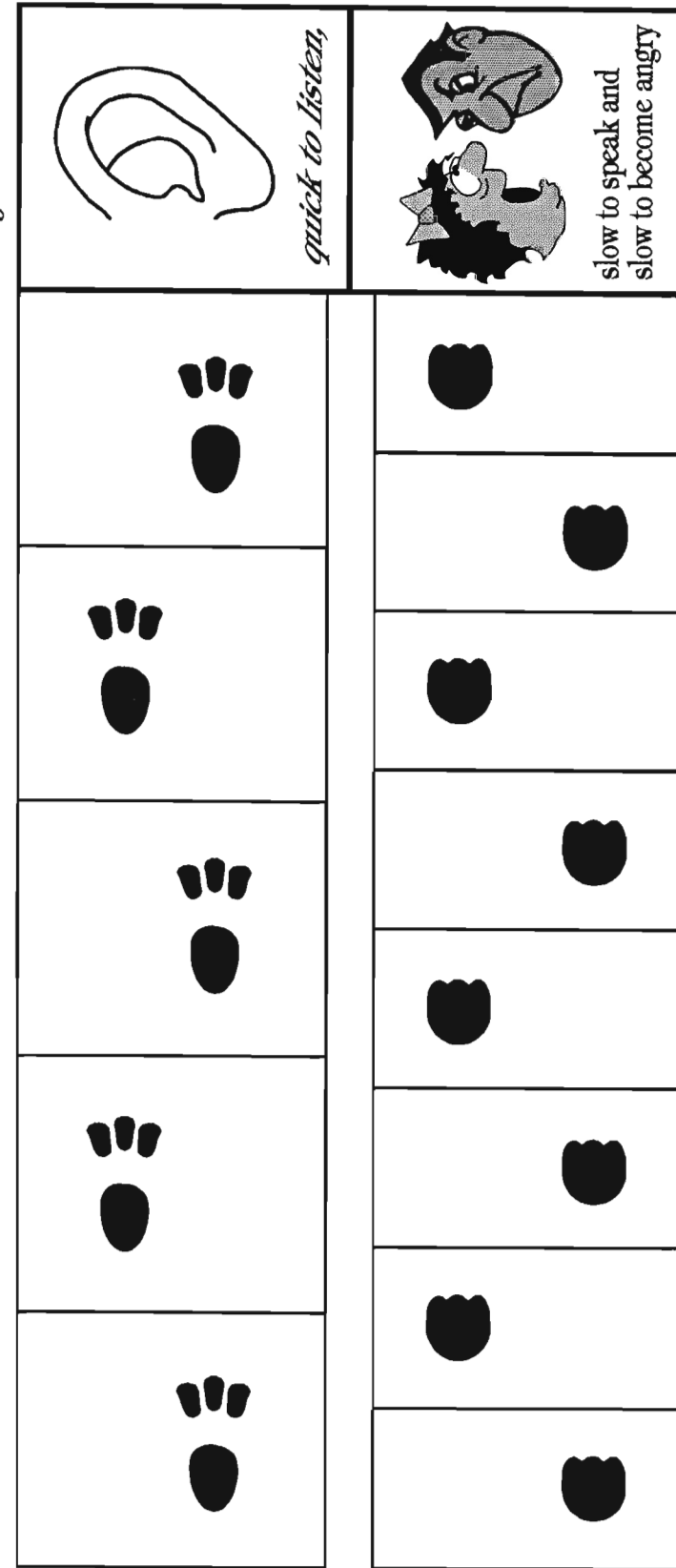
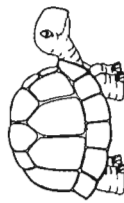


The TORTOISE and the HARE Race

PAGE 1 OF 3. Cut out game board above, along horizontal line. Mount on colored poster board, to make it more sturdy. Color. Cut out rabbit and turtle game pieces along solid lines; fold in half along dotted line so they will stand. Cut out 32 game cards (on following 2 pages). Tape or glue an envelope to back of board to store game cards and game pieces in.

Play "The TORTOISE and the HARE Race" with 2 players. Mix up game cards; place, face down, in a pile. Place rabbit and turtle behind the starting line, on their respective pictures. Begin the game by saying the full verse together. The rabbit player starts by drawing the top card from the card pile. Because the rabbit is quick, he wants to be "quick to listen". If the ear is drawn, rabbit player says, "quick to listen" and hops forward one rabbit square. If woman is drawn, he/she says "slow to speak" but does not move rabbit. If man is drawn, he/she says "slow to become angry" but does not move rabbit. After rabbit's turn, the turtle player draws the next card. Because the turtle is slow, he wants to be "slow to speak and slow to become angry." If ear is drawn, turtle player says, "quick to listen," but does not move turtle. If woman is drawn, he says "slow to speak" and crawls forward one turtle square. If man is drawn, he says "slow to become angry" and crawls forward one turtle square. Game continues, alternating turns. First player to reach last box (picture box) wins the game.
